- 4. What promises from God do you need to be reminded of in this season of your life? Be open to suggestions from those close to you.
- 5. What limitations are you facing when it comes to making Christmas all it can be? How can you make yourself available to God and allow him to remove these limitations?
- 6. What is God doing in your life that requires you to faithfully follow his leading? Be specific.
