- 3. Reflect on Colossians 2:18, where Paul warns against those who take pleasure in false humility and the worship of angels. How might these warnings apply to modern-day believers? What can we learn about discernment in our faith?
- 4. In verses 20-22, Paul advises against adhering to human regulations and self-imposed worship. How can we discern between genuine Christian practices and human-made rules? List a few specific examples.
- 5. Colossians 2:23 highlights the ineffectiveness of self-imposed religious rules in combating sinful desires. How can we apply this truth to our personal struggles with sin and our pursuit of a more authentic and vibrant faith?
- 6. How can a deeper understanding of the warnings and guidance in Colossians 2:16-23 help us to maintain a Christ-centered, authentic faith and resist the temptation to rely on external rituals and regulations for our spiritual identity and growth?
- 7. In what ways are you "holding fast to the Head" (verse 19)? How does God's Word help you to do this better? Prayer? The church?
