The following questions can be used for Small Group discussions or for personal reflection:

- 1. Describe a time when you communicated very clearly with someone. Now describe a time when communication failed. What were those experiences like for you? For the other person?
- 2. Read Ephesians 3:7-12. Does it surprise you that God has chosen to use the church, full of imperfect people, to be his chosen instrument to spread the message of the gospel?
- 3. Now read Romans 10:14-15. Describe the urgency this passage conveys about sharing the Gospel. Who are you sharing it with?
- 4. What is the point of preaching? Who is called to preach?
- 5. What does Paul mean when he tells Timothy to "be ready in season and out of season"?
- 6. How has our culture turned away from "listening" to the truth and pursued what their "itching ears" want to hear?
- 7. Consider this statement by John Stott: "Churches live, grow, and flourish by God's Word, but they languish and perish without it." Do you agree or disagree? Why?
- 8. For further study, read and discuss the following Scriptures: Matthew 16:13-18; 1 Thessalonians 2:13; Romans 10:14-15; Hebrews 4:12; Matthew 4:4; Acts 1:8; Ephesians 4:11-12; Romans 1:16-17.
