The following questions can be used for Small Group discussions or for personal reflection:

- 1. What are some organizations that you belong to as a member? What is the point of membership in such organizations?
- 2. In Acts 2, 3000 people were baptized after Peter's call to repent and be baptized. To what were they added? How is that different from the organizations in Ouestion 1?
- 3. Read through Ephesians 2. Did you notice the plural language in there? The concept of "us"? Why is this important to his discussion to the Ephesians?
- 4. Now read 1 Corinthians 12:12-27. What did you notice about the imagery that Paul uses in this passage? How should this apply to the church of 2024?
- 5. What is the point of the church, according to these two passages?
- 6. What is the difference between a contract and a covenant?
- 7. List as many reasons as you can think of why you need the church.
- 8. For further study, read and discuss the following Scriptures: Romans 12:5, Hebrews 13:17; Acts 2:42-47; 1 Peter 5:1-5.
