Matters for Reflection and Discussion:

- 1. How does the phrase "In the beginning was the Word" (John 1:1) emphasize Jesus' eternal existence? Why is it important to understand that Jesus existed before creation?
- 2. Why is it significant that "the Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us" (verse 14)? What does this reveal about God's desire to connect with humanity?
- 3. What does it mean for Jesus to be both "light" and "life"? How does this description impact your understanding of his mission?
- 4. How do you see this light at work in the world today, and how can we reflect it?
- 5. What does John mean by stating that those who believe in Jesus "have the right to become children of God" (verse 12)? How does this transform our relationship with God and others?
- 6. How does Jesus reveal God's glory, and how should this shape our worship and relationship with him?
- 7. How have you experienced God's grace in your life? What does this teach us about God's character?
- 8. Why is it essential for grace and truth to coexist in Jesus, and how can we reflect both in our own lives?
- 9. How does Jesus uniquely reveal the nature and character of God? How does this impact the way you respond to him?
