- 2. Paul emphasizes gentleness in his approach to the Thessalonians. How can we practice gentleness in our relationships, especially when addressing difficult issues?
- 3. What are some practical ways we can "share our lives" with others in addition to sharing the gospel?
- 4. Paul worked tirelessly to avoid being a burden to others. How can we balance serving others sacrificially while also setting healthy boundaries?
- 5. In what ways can we demonstrate selfless love in a world that often promotes self-interest and personal gain?
- 6. Paul's love for the Thessalonians was active and sacrificial. What are some specific ways we can love others in a way that costs us something?
- 7. How do you personally respond when faced with the need to sacrifice your own comfort or convenience for the sake of others?
- 8. What role does patience play in loving others well, and how can we grow in patience in our relationships?
- 9. How does Paul's example in this passage reflect the love of Christ, and how can we apply this to our daily lives?
