Matters for Reflection and Discussion:

- 1. What does Paul's desire to "supply what is lacking in your faith" reveal about his understanding of spiritual growth?
- 2. How can we adopt a similar concern for the growth of others in our church or community?
- 3. Paul prayed "night and day" for the Thessalonians. What does this teach us about the role of prayer in spiritual relationships?
- 4. In verse 12, Paul asks the Lord to make their love "increase and abound." What might it look like for love to overflow in a church today?
- 5. Why is it important for Christian love to extend beyond the immediate church community?
- 6. How does Paul's example challenge the way we usually pray for others? What adjustments could you make to your own prayer life to reflect his priorities?
- 7. How are love and holiness connected in the Christian life?
- 8. Paul's prayer focuses on being prepared for the return of Christ. How can we live each day in light of that hope?
- 9. Who in your life needs encouragement in their faith, and how can you begin to pray for them like Paul did for the Thessalonians?
