- 1 Thessalonians 4:3 (ESV)

What Is Sexual Immorality?

πορνεία (porneia): Any form of sexual activity that does not take place within the boundaries of marriage.

How Do We Avoid It?

 $\dot{\alpha}π \dot{\epsilon} \chi \omega$ (apecho): To refrain, to stay as distant as possible, to flee from.

Practical Action Steps:

Pray.

Don't treat this lightly.

Seek accountability.

Dig into the Word.



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Matters for Reflection and Discussion:

- 1. What does the term "sexual immorality" encompass, and why is it important to understand it biblically rather than culturally?
- 2. How does God's design for sexuality within marriage protect us rather than restrict us? Can you think of examples where stepping outside this design led to harm?
- 3. Paul says it is God's will for us to be sanctified. How does sexual purity relate to our overall growth in holiness?
- 4. Paul tells us to avoid or abstain from such immorality. What does this teach us about how we should approach temptation? How is this different from simply "resisting" it?
- 5. In practical terms, what does it look like to "flee" from sexual immorality in everyday life (media, relationships, thoughts)?
- 6. How can prayer serve as a defense and a weapon in the battle for purity? What should we be asking God for in this area?
- 7. Why is it dangerous to treat sexual sin lightly, and what are some of the spiritual consequences of doing so?
- 8. What role does accountability play in helping us pursue sexual purity? What qualities make someone a good accountability partner?
- 9. If someone has failed in this area, how can the gospel offer hope, healing, and a path forward? How can the church be a place of both truth and grace for them?
