God Blesses Us So That We Can Know His Favor

God's blessing is ultimately about his presence.

We should never become so focused on the blessing that we forget the Blessor.

God Blesses Us So That Others Can Know Him

God's blessings are meant to move through us, not merely to us.

The church should be known not merely for what it receives, but for what it gives.

God Blesses Us So That The Nations Can Rejoice

God's blessing always points beyond ourselves.

Joy grows when we become part of something bigger than ourselves.

God Blesses Us So That We Can Live Under His Rule

God's blessing is found in living under God's direction.

The Ultimate Blessing Is Becoming A Blessing

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Matters for Reflection and Discussion:

1. When you hear the phrase "God has blessed me," what are the first things that come to mind?
2. Psalm 67:1 asks God to bless his people. Why do you think verse 2 immediately gives a purpose for that blessing?
3. What is the difference between being blessed by God and living as a blessing to others?
4. What are some blessings God has given you that you could use more intentionally for his purposes?
5. Why is it sometimes easy to enjoy God's blessings while forgetting the One who gave them?
6. How can our church demonstrate that God's blessings are meant to flow through us rather than simply to us?
7. Think about a difficult season you've experienced. How might God use that experience to encourage someone else?
8. What keeps us from being generous with our time, resources, attention, or abilities?
9. Who is one person in your life who could use some encouragement or practical help from you this week?
10. What would change if you began each day praying, "God, who can I bless today?"
